- ¹ 'At the heart of the church/place of worship' means someone whose family worships twice a month or more. The worshipper might be the child or one or more parents/carers. This must be for a period of at least two years prior to the date of application (where families have moved within the last two years, they may also ask for their previous place of worship to provide a reference).
- ² 'Attached to the church/place of worship' means someone whose family worships at least once every 2 months. The worshipper might be the child or one or more parents/carers. This must be for a period of at least two years prior to the date of application (where families have moved within the last two years, they may also ask for their previous place of worship to provide a reference).

Don't forget that the deadline for applying for high school 2025 is 31st October.
